IMPACT! Such a small word, but one that encapsulates our mission and our drive every day at Junior Achievement of the Michigan Great Lakes (JAMGL). But what is *impact*? We often talk about the number of students we serve and the number of volunteers who have interacted with those students, but the real impact is in the lives we are able to change. JAMGL offers financial empowerment to students, fostering confidence, knowledge and determination for youth to thrive - building a better future for themselves and their communities.

This summary of our year shows the hard work and collaboration of staff, board members, volunteers, donors, schools, administration, teachers and students. And while the numbers are important to highlight, we would like to call attention to the important work that has been accomplished and continues to be done related to growth in area, student numbers and in programming.

In 2018 - 2019, we increased our reach by over 5,000 students, we were in 51 new schools and utilized 60 new volunteers. These increases allowed us to provide an additional 28,000+ instructional hours throughout the region. But what does that mean from a student perspective? For high school student Nicholas Meschke it means...



We look to continue this progress through the continued growth in these areas and in the continued expansion into new rural areas.



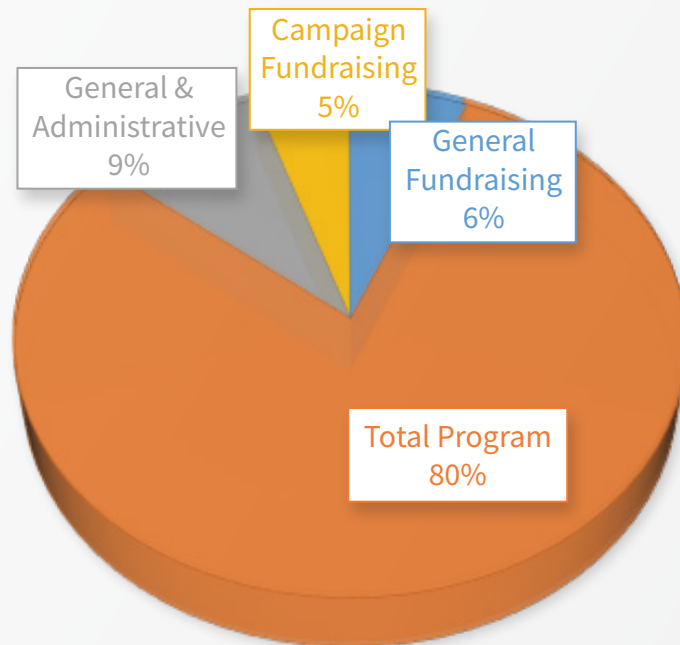
